

Application and Participation

1. Announcements for the various components of the Leadership Development Institute are made at the 100 Black Men of America Annual National Conference.
2. Distribution of applications are made at the appropriate time prior to the beginning of each Training component.
3. Deadline for each Fellows Program is provided on the application.
4. Interested members, youth Mentees and other participants are required to submit applications for review and selection.
5. A letter of acceptance is sent to applicants confirming their participation in a specific program and key training dates. Participants are required to sign a Letter of Commitment.
6. Participants attend Fellowship training as instructed in their Acceptance Announcement.
7. Participants are provided Leadership Training Toolkit and a calendar of events for their training component at the Orientation session.
8. Participants complete Fellows Training for their specific component and receive a certificate of completion at a Graduation ceremony held during the 100 Black Men of America Annual National Conference.

Mission

The 100 Leadership Institute is a balanced and comprehensive development of leadership skills for youth and adults designed to build their individual and collective capacities in an effort to strengthen community life.

Objectives

The Objectives of the 100 Leadership Development Institute are to:

Develop a core of African/African American male leadership worldwide.

Stimulate an appreciation for African/African American male leadership worldwide.

Expose leadership core to various leadership skills, opportunities and challenges.

Inform leadership core on the current and emerging economic, social, political, communal and cultural issues affecting African/African Americans and people of color in America and the world.

Nurture a network of positive leaders (youth and adults) by providing opportunities for them to interact on various social and cultural settings.

Promote and encourage community and civic involvement.

Link the Leadership Development Institute with various institutions (public and private) focused on the development of African/African American communities worldwide.

Training Components

The 100 Leadership Development Institute provides the following training components:

100 Chapter Leadership Development Program (100 CLDP) • Focus: Chapter Executive/Members

The Chapter Leadership Development Program (CLDP) is a two day seminar designed to provide participants with a comprehensive in-depth learning experience.

100 Youth Leadership Fellows Program (100 YLFP) • Focus: Youth ages 16-20

The 100 Youth Leadership Fellows Program is a six-month leadership development program designed to prepare youth participants for future leadership responsibilities. The YLFP orientation and training is conducted during the 100 Black Men of America Annual National Conference.

100 Leadership Institute Fellows Program (100LIF) • Focus: Men Ages 21 and over

The 100 Leadership Institute Fellows Program (100LIFP) is a one year training program designed to strengthen leadership skills. The 10 participants will meet three times a year.

100 Virtual Think Tank (100 VTT) • Focus: All 100LDI Participants and 100 BMOA Members

In order to provide a forum and a systematic approach to generating a futuristic agenda, the Institute for Innovation proposes a collaborative effort with 100 Black Men to establish a virtual online think tank that can harness the collective brainpower of our best and brightest.

We will address themes related to the mission of the 100 in a forum concurrent with 100 events. A panel of our top experts and leaders in this area will be invited to initiate the discussion by delivering a plenary session on key topic areas.

This unique, collaborative and intellectual effort will be based on a series of online brainstorming experiences to explore new ideas, opportunities and challenges for the future of African descendants, particularly in North America. Invited emerging leaders will participate in breakout sessions to discuss opportunities and challenges using the bisociation creative thinking techniques presented by the workshop facilitator.
